## Highway Dept. Perspective

- MS4 Stormwater Program Efforts:
  - Mapping outfalls and structure
  - Incorporating best management practices (BMPs) into town projects where possible
  - Added Illicit Discharge Bylaw
  - Heightened awareness
- Maintenance & Programming
  - Country Drainage By default on small town roads! There IS maintenance BUT no catch basins to clean, no piping to worry about, the system is fully visible and easy to access for maintenance and/or repair and FAR cheaper to install!
  - Partnerships with local groups promoting BMPs
